student success in college describes policies programs and practices that a diverse set of institutions have used to enhance student achievement this book clearly shows the benefits of student learning and educational effectiveness that can be realized when these conditions are present based on the documenting effective educational practice deep project from the center for postsecondary research at indiana university this book provides concrete examples from twenty institutions that other colleges and universities can learn from and adapt to help create a success oriented campus culture and learning environment

issues of retention and student success are now topics of great interest government and the he sector have woken up to the implications for public

finance and equity of students not completing their studies core reading for policy makers higher education managers and lecturers

for much of the twentieth century the definition of success for most community colleges revolved around student retention and graduation this definition no longer works if it ever did in student success in the community college what really works respected community college leaders researchers and innovators argue that student success is about redesigning community colleges in a manner that is consistent with each college's mission goals student population and resources concluding that there is no one size fits all approach to increasing student success chapter authors analyze national state and regional efforts to increase student success identify principles institutions can use to frame student success initiatives and outline specific actions community colleges can take to increase student and institutional success student success in the community college what really works also provides concrete examples of effective student success initiatives in a variety of community college settings

despite increased spending and efforts at reform since the elementary and secondary education act of 1965 wide achievement gaps persist between groups of students and these gaps increase with each year of schooling obstacles to student achievement can be found in schools and at home and finding innovative solutions for students to overcome these obstacles is a motivating force behind this volume inside the authors argue that the other three rs reasoning resilience and responsibility can promote achievement and the realization of full academic potential especially for students who are labeled as under performers the other three rs tottrs are universal learning skills available to all students although each of tottrs is related to school and life success they are most effective when they are used in combination for example in the course problem solving reasoning skills offer the ability to judge which strategies best address the needs of a particular situation responsibility provides understanding of the consequences for oneself and others of employing or not employing different problem solving strategies and taking ownership of the results and resilience produces the patience to work through the problem solving process by capitalizing on lessons learned until achieving desired outcomes the other three r s model began as an american psychological association apa initiative sponsored by robert j sternberg ibm professor of psychology and education at yale university and past president of the apa for the initiative and this edited volume sternberg and subotnick assembled a diverse team of experts who identified reasoning resilience and responsibility as three learnable skills that when taken together have great potential for increasing academic success the authors of this volume present in detail their evidence based arguments for promoting tottrs in schools as a way to optimize student success

this book turns the traditional approach to student success on its head by examining the learning habits of successful students based on what they have told us about their learning strategies on what they do to succeed in college and on the teaching practices they think best foster their learning this approach is in stark contrast to most recent studies of learning at the college level which focus on what students need to do to succeed but are written from the point of view of experts who provide advice to struggling students learning from the learners successful college students share

their effective learning habits is based on what expert students tell us about what they as learners do to succeed it is grounded in a 10 year study that rests on a rich qualitative data set that includes open ended survey responses gathered on a term by term basis and in depth interviews during the freshman and junior years with over 700 students of diverse backgrounds additionally since many students interviewed were the first in their family to attend college and from backgrounds traditionally underserved by higher education the book s insights will be of particular interest to educators elsewhere who are increasingly expected to help similar students succeed themes include student success academic challenges diversity pedagogy and technology in the classroom no other book on the widely discussed subject of student success relies on such a wealth of quantitative and qualitative data about what works from the point of view of students themselves
